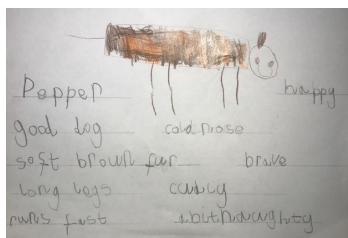


Class 1

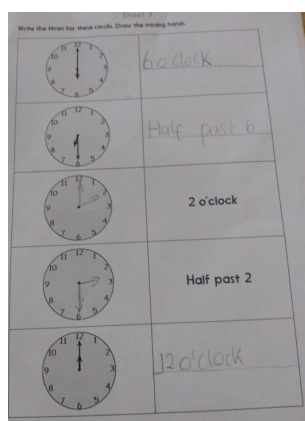
Children have been shape hunting and learning about patterns, 2D and 3D shapes in Maths.

Class 2



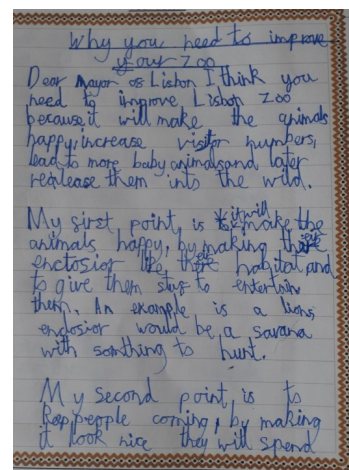
Class 2 children have been learning to tell the time in Maths.

In English Class 2 have been planning their own stories.

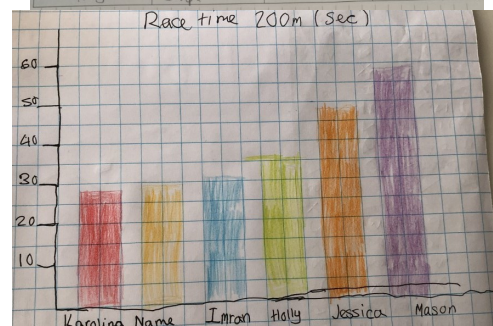


Class 3

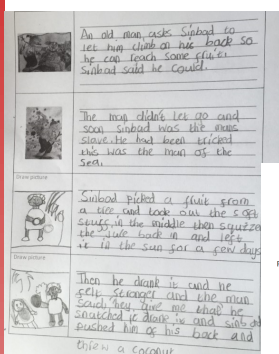


In Maths they have been drawing and interpreting data in bar graphs.
