- ► The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) statutory framework sets standards for the learning, development and care of your child from birth to 5 years old. The standards ensure your child will learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe.
- ▶ 7 areas of learning we develop next steps for your child within lessons and through enhancing continuous provision.
- Assessed at the end of year against a good level of development ELG

Assessment

- ▶ End of year Early Years Foundation Stage Profile, reported on in the Summer
- Assessed against 17 Early Learning Goals
- Good Level of Development = Children achieving the expected standard in the three prime areas, plus Literacy and Mathematics






Phonics and Reading






Sounds with 2 letters - digraphs and special friends

The children will be assessed initially after 3 weeks and then half-termly to ensure they are in the correct small group.

Length of the lesson increases over time.

Read at home, share stories, listen to stories, rhyme time


If your child develops a negative view towards reading come and let us know!

Our deeper exploration of stories encouraging children to think about stories, be imaginative and make meaningful marks in relation to the text.








Mathematics

- Number focused
- Counting to 20
- Counting at home wherever possible
- Subitising up to 5 white rose 1 minute maths
- Knowing everything about a number up to 10
- ▶ 1 more and 1 less than a number



Challenge mountain

- A number of challenges throughout which mean the children can move up the challenge mountain. The amount of challenges per week will increase throughout the year.
- Ensures they experience play/activities in all the areas of the classroom.
- Increases independence.


Belongings

Topic - Summer


Summer 1 - Food
