As writers, we will write narratives, explanations, diary entries and play scripts.

As Mathematicians, we will be continuing with multiplication and division followed by length and perimeter, fractions and mass and capacity (Y3) and decimals (Y4)

As Scientists, we will investigate electricity including appliances, circuits and components. During the second half term we will explore how we hear and how sound travels.

As Historians, we will find out about Tudor monarchs, buildings, clothes and food through a local study of Ledbury.

As Geographers, we will be learning about Ledbury.
